f) To exchange, on a reciprocal basis, students at Undergraduate, Graduate and Doctoral levels for limited periods of time for purpose of education and for research.
KCP and MRADCH further agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be separately determined and agreed upon by the two institutions. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation, etc.

2. Joint Sponsored Research, Development and Consulting

CP and MRADCH agree to help identify and invite faculty members from each oth institution to participate in research or development programmes. The terms and conditions for such participation will be worked out by mutual agreement between KCP and MRADCH.

3. Exchange of Faculty and Student

KCP and MRADCH agree to encourage collaboration between faculty members/students from

undertake short visits to, or take up fixed-term visiting assignments at, each other's institution

8. Co-ordination
Each institution shall appoint one member of its research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee, consisting of (a) The Director, KGI representing the KCP (b) The Principal, MRADCH (c) Programme coordinator from the side of KCP, and (d) Programme Coordinator from the side of MRADCH, will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.





9. Tenure and Termination

This MoU will take effect from the date it is signed by representatives of the two institutions. It will remain valid for three years, and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and agreement. Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice to the other institution six months in advance. Once terminated, neither KCP nor MRADCH will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, KCP nor MRADCH will ensure that all activities in progress are allowed to complete

10. Dispute Resolution

Any dispute connected with this agreement or arising therefrom or related thereto in any matter whatsoever shall be resolved by mutual discussion or conciliation between KCP and MRDCH. If the dispute is not settled within 90 days' time it shall be referred to a sole arbitrator to be jointly appointed by the parties. In case the parties do not agree on the appointment of the sole arbitrator then the matter will be referred to a panel of 3 arbitrators constituted by 1 arbitrator each to be appointed by both the parties and the third arbitrator to be appointed by the 2 duly appointed arbitrators. The arbitration will be conducted in accordance with the provision set forth in the Indian arbitration and conciliation Act, 1996 (The "Act"). The place for holding such arbitration proceedings shall be Bengaluru. The arbitration shall be conducted in the English language. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding upon both parties. The parties agree that only the courts in Bengaluru in the Republic of India shall have jurisdiction to entertain the proceedings related to this agreement whether during pendency or after expiry/termination. No other courts shall have jurisdiction.

- 22 OHC shall provide oral health services minimum for 8 (8/10) days in a month at Doddamaralawadi Government Primary Health Center, Kanakapura Taluk, Ramanagara District, Karnataka as agreed upon in writing.
- 2.3 Parties agree to operationalize the OHC within a period of one (1) month from the date of this MOU. Parties shall use the OHC for the purpose detailed hereunder for a period of Three (3) year from the date of commencement of operation unless any unforeseen event occurs.
- 2.4 OHC shall be branded as "Oral Health Center". Co-Branding shall be considered at the appropriate places and promotional materials, as per the branding guidelines of First Party.
- 2.5 In the course of running the OHC, if the parties mutually feel that it is not feasible to continue with the arrangement for any reason whatsoever, the Parties may adopt the following:
 - a) discuss and agree on new strategies to successfully operate the Oral Health Center;
 - b) Plan for new strategies to operate the OHC based project for a period of not less than three (3) months;
 - c) if the Second Party is unable to operate the OHC successfully despite new strategies, both the Parties shall mutually decide on the way forward, which include operation, transfer of rights, termination of this agreement, etc.

3. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

3.1 Roles and Responsibilities of the First Party.

- a. First Party shall install the Dental Chair/Dental instruments suitable for OHC Project, customise the Dental Unit with all equipment and machineries required for carry out the services under this MOU
- b. Provide advice and guide the Second Party on the requirements to run the OHC.
- c. Shall recruit eligible and efficient Dentists/Staff/Lab Technicians/Nurses for the OHC and shall be responsible for the payment of their salary

In furtherance and promotion of the above mentioned aims and objectives, the First Party has unanimously decided to support the Oral Health Center at Doddamaralawadi Government Primary Health Center, Kanakapura Taluk, Ramanagara District, Karnataka with technical support and Dental treatments.

WHEREAS, the Second Party, a reputed Charitable Trust, is carrying out its charitable, philanthropic and social activities in the medical and allied field throughout India and has obtained large achievements and success in these fields.

AND WHEREAS, Both the parties have decided to collaborate each other for running the Oral Health Center ("OHC") and to provide Dental aid to the general public in Maralawadi Hobli, Kanakapura Taluk, Ramanagara District as per the terms specifically mentioned hereunder.

NOW THEREOF THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to setup the Oral Health Center ("OHC") to provide improved access to health care services in all areas including the underserved and marginalised backward areas, Suburban regions and industrial segments of Maralawadi Hobil, Kanakapura Taluk which can be later extended to other districts of Karnataka as agreed upon in writing. The aim is to provide access to quality Dental healthcare services to patients who are not able to access private health care system in both urban and rural areas of the state of Karnataka.

2. OHC OPERATIVE

2.1 Parties, after deliberations, agreed to associate and support each other in the OHC Project, as more particularly set out hereauder.

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- b) Parties agreed that in case of difference of opinion between the parties in future, it shall not have a ceasing effect on the operations of the OHC and any matter of dispute shall be discussed and settled by the Parties amicably within a period of one (1) month from the date of the Party notifying the other of such disputes or disagreements or breaches. In case the Parties are not able to resolve the disagreements or breach (es) of their respective responsibilities within the notice period, this MoU will be treated as terminated and in such case, the Second Party shall immediately hand over all material to the First Party in the same condition as when handed over, with all accessories, equipment intact, except for normal wear and tear excepted.
- c) Any transfer or assignment or disposition its services shall be done only with the prior written consent of First Party.
- d) All information related to the operation of the Project and information related to the Parties shared or gathered directly or indirectly by the other parties herein during the operation of the Project and those that are not available to the public shall be treated with utmost confidence and each party agrees to keep that information confidential during the term of this MOU and thereafter.
- e) All notices, requests, demands or other communications required or permitted under this MOU shall be given in writing and shall be deemed effectively given (i) on the date of service if served personally or transmitted by electronic facsimile on the party to whom notice is to be given (ii) on the date of service if transmitted by e-mail ensuring delivery (iii) one day after prepaid dispatch by overnight courier to the Party.
- f) This MOU shall be governed by and construed under the laws applicable in Bengaluru and the disputes if any related to the terms and conditions of this MOU, after failing to mutually agree and settle between the parties or by the Management Committee, shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts in Bengaluru
- g) This MOU shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the legal heirs, successors-in-title, executors, legal representatives, administrators, permitted successors and assigns of the Parties.
- h) Any amendment or modification to the terms of this agreement shall be effective if it is made in writing and signed by authorised signatories of both the parties.

7. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This memorandum of understanding constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes and replaces all prior and contemporaneous understandings, communications, MOU's or agreements, written or oral, regarding such subject matter. This MOU may be executed in one original and one duplicate, each of which will constitute an original agreement, but taken together will constitute one and the same instrument. The original of this agreement shall be kept with the First party and the duplicate copy shall be kept with the Second party.

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

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
